# CoC Eligible Expenses: Transportation



## Eligible costs on the **Supportive Services budget line item (BLI)**:

- Participants' travel on public transportation or in a provider's vehicle for case management and other eligible supportive services activities
- Purchasing or leasing a vehicle in which staff transports participants and/or staff serving participants;
  - Includes gas, insurance, taxes, and maintenance for the vehicle
- If public transportation in area is not sufficient, one-time payment for car repairs or maintenance required to operate a participant's personal vehicle (limits apply)
- Mileage allowance for staff to visit participants and inspect units
- Costs for staff to accompany/assist participants to use public transportation

# How can we pay for furniture?

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- Furniture for participant units is eligible under the Operating Budget Line Item (BLI).
- In this NOFO, can shift up to 10% of a BLI item to another BLI (For example, support services to operating)
- Rental Assistance Projects cannot have an Operating BLI.

# How can we pay for household supplies?

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- Supplies used to maintain/repair housing units are **Operating** costs.
  - If necessary to assist participant to obtain/maintain housing and function independently in the community, costs of teaching life skills are Supportive Services expenses (life skills training)
  - E.g., kitchen wares, linens & cleaning supplies necessary to teach household management and nutrition skills.
- Costs of activities to engage participants for the purpose of providing immediate support and identifying potential participants are eligible **Supportive Service** expenses (outreach)
  - includes addressing “urgent physical needs” such as providing blankets, clothes and toiletries.



# Making Changes to Renewal Evaluation Standards

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- CoC adopted revised performance standards for renewing PSH, RRH, TH and Joint TH-RRH for 2025 evaluation
- Rollout will require extensive database (RED) testing to ensure accuracy.
- HUD released 2 NOFOs at the same time.
  - Increased risk for renewal funding in 2024.
  - Focus on the Competitions is critical to increase chances of all renewals continuing to receive funding and of securing funding for new projects.
- Rollout of changes tabled for next year when the CoC competition will require fewer resources.



# 2024 CoC Program NOFO Highlights

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CT BOS must submit an application to HUD for existing projects to renew and for new funds – must compete with other CoCs.

Estimated Maximum funding available for CT BOS\*:

- Tier 1: \$48,355,371 (90% of Annual Renewal Demand)
- Tier 2: \$15,008,998
  - \$5,372,819 (10% of Annual Renewal Demand)
  - CoC Bonus (new funds): \$6,876,029
  - Domestic Violence Bonus (new funds): \$2,760,150
- YHDP Renewals: \$3,572,048
- Planning Grant: \$1,500,000 – not Ranked in any Tier



**TOTAL: Approximately \$68.4 Million** -\* Info above is estimated - final info from HUD pending

# What's the Same?

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Project applications very similar to 2023.

Scoring and CoC Application questions very similar to 2023:

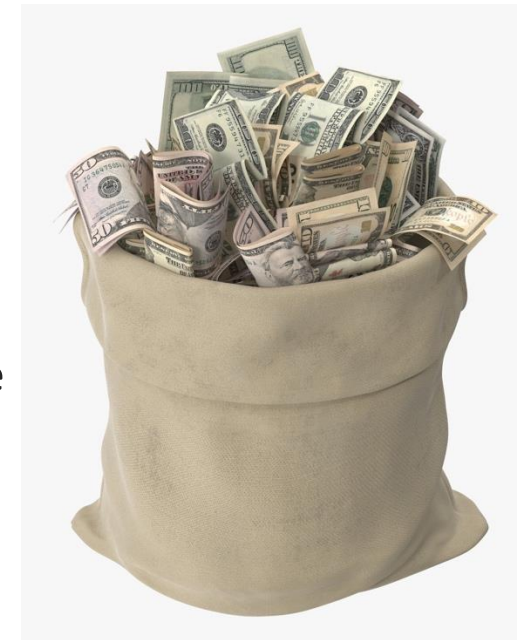
- System Performance (30% of Score)
- Coordination with & Engagement of Diverse Stakeholders (42% of Score)
  - *Includes involving PLEH, advancing race equity, meeting the needs of LGBTQ+ population, use of Housing First*
- Evaluating and Ranking Projects (14% of score)
- HMIS & Point in Time Count (7% of Score)
- Housing & Healthcare Leveraging (7% of Score)

# What's New?

## More \$\$, Potential for More New Projects + More Risk

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- Supportive Services and HMIS Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA)!!!!
  - Applied by HUD post application to SS and HMIS budget line items
  - Estimated at 4.8% of the current budget lines
  - Requires additional match
- All YHDP grants will be renewed non-competitively.
- CoC Bonus amount is 12% of final pro rata need (7% last year)
  - Enough to fund all new projects that passed threshold review with \$ to spare
- DV Bonus Project amount is 15% of preliminary pro rata need
  - 10% last year
  - Can apply for more money for new DV Bonus projects
- Tier 1 decreased from 93% to 90% - more renewal funds at risk
  - Level of risk depends on CoC Application score
  - BOS 2023 Application Score was 175.5 (highest score was 185.5 & median was 151.5)



# What's New? Two Year NOFO

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- New and renewal projects still apply for a one-year term.
- Grants renewed in 2024 will automatically renew without a project application in 2025.
- SNOFO projects and new projects awarded in 2024 will submit project applications in 2025.
- HUD will apply FMR adjustments.
- No CoC Application in 2025 so 2024 score is even more important!
- If Congress allocates sufficient funding for new projects, there may be a new project competition – will use 2024 CoC application score.

# What's New? CoC Application Changes

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## Points for CoC applications:

- ✓ Increase in rate of exits from street outreach to positive destinations
- ✓ Steps to improve fidelity to the Housing First model
- ✓ Increased use of social services in lieu of law enforcement for unsheltered
- ✓ Preventing homelessness for people leaving public systems
- ✓ How CoC collaborated with underserved communities to design or operate programs that equitably benefit them and addressed their needs
- ✓ How the CoC successfully advanced racial equity
- ✓ How homeless information is communicated and addressed in the Con Plans

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- Providers will be notified by the end of August if application has been accepted to submit to HUD.
- Providers will have 2 weeks to complete initial draft.
- Housing Innovations will hold office hours & provide technical assistance – date TBA.

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# Ranking and Tiering Background

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- HUD requires CoCs to rank projects based on project performance on system performance measures and local priorities.
- HUD sets the amount of funding that CoCs can put in each of two “Tiers”.
  - Projects in **Tier 1** (\$ 48,355,371) are ensured funding assuming HUD requirements met.
    - 90% of the money needed to fund existing renewal projects is in Tier 1.
  - **Tier 2:** Projects in Tier 2 (\$ 15,008,998) are scored on 100-point basis and compete nationally – funded in order of project scores until all CoC funds exhausted
    - Projects ranked higher in Tier 2 are more likely to get funded

# Ranking and Tiering Background - 2

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- In 2024, HUD will renew YHDP (Youth Homelessness Demonstration Projects) “non-competitively” meaning CoCs won’t rank YHDP projects
- CoC Planning grant applications are not ranked
- Historically, the CoC has ranked projects using a combination of
  - *performance evaluation scores*
  - *new project application scores*
  - *model type and*
  - *best mathematical approach to increase score in Tier 2 and maximize funds received*

# Prior Ranking Strategies

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- Renewal projects have been ranked above new projects in order of evaluation score
  - Prevents housing loss for people living in existing projects
  - CT BOS works with renewals to correct performance issues.
  - Renewals with repeated, long-standing performance issues are reallocated.
  - Renewal projects that have not been evaluated have been ranked below scored projects, but before new projects.
- Coordinated Entry and HMIS placed in Tier 1 to ensure funding.
  - These are system-wide services that are required by HUD.
- New projects have been ranked in Tier 2.
- *Projects at greatest risk of not being funded are new – reduces housing risks for existing participants.*

# Related Decisions Made by the Steering Committee in 2024

- Set-aside funding for enhanced services in existing CoC-funded PSH and RRH with a preference for proposals for services in PSH projects with no designated services funding.
- Set-aside funding for projects targeting people aged 60 and older.
- Preference for projects that qualify for HUD Housing Leverage points
  - At least 25% of the units designated to serve people experiencing homelessness are subsidized by a source other than CoC or ESG
- CoC Competition funds may be used to support Coordinated Entry if funding is available.

# Proposed 2024 Ranking Order

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1. **Renewal** PSH, RRH and Joint TH-RRH Projects that have been evaluated in order of 2024 score. Projects with identical scores ranked based on budget from largest to smallest.
2. **Renewal** HMIS and Coordinated Entry projects will be ranked at the bottom of Tier 1 to ensure continued funding.
3. The remaining evaluated **Renewal** Projects will be ranked at the top of Tier 2 in order of evaluation score.
4. **Renewal** Projects that have not been evaluated will follow in an order that considers the maximum advantage on HUD's relative need scoring factor.



# Proposed 2024 Ranking Order (2)

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## Proposed General Ranking Order (con't)

5. **Expansion** applications for existing PSH projects with no services funding applying for services funds.
  - The ranking will start with those projects serving people 60 and older and follow in order of application score.
6. **Expansion** applications for existing PSH and RRH with services funds below \$5,000 per household applying for services funds to reach the \$9000 cap.
  - The ranking will start with those projects for people 60 and older and follow in order of application score.
7. **New Coordinated Entry** projects.
8. **New PSH** projects starting with those projects for people 60 and older and then in order of application score.

# Proposed 2024 Ranking Order (3)



## Proposed General Ranking Order (con't)

9. **New** RRH projects in order of application score.
10. **DV Bonus** projects ranked in an order based on the project application score followed by unscored DV Bonus Projects (submitted subsequent to the scoring process in order to ensure that CT BOS applies for as much DV Bonus funding as possible). DV Bonus Projects will be funded regardless of ranking if selected by HUD in the DV Bonus competition
11. If applications don't fully expend the available CoC or DV Bonus funds, final budgets will be increased based on need across CANs using the BNL or other similar equitable standard and provider capacity.
12. If the CoC bonus allocation decreases the amount of funds for new projects below current projections, final budgets will be reduced based on need across CANS using the BNL or other similar equitable standard.



# Proposed COLA Policy

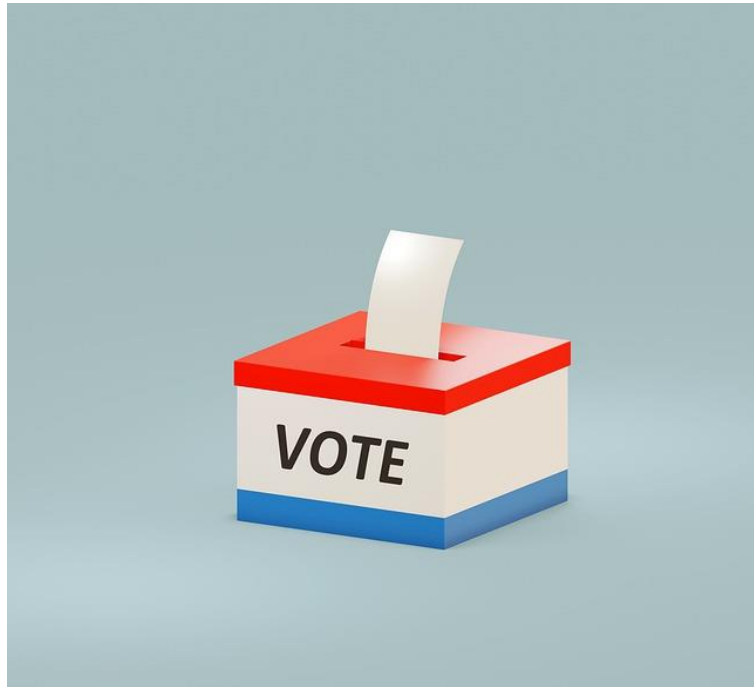
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- HUD will apply a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)
- Estimated at 4.8% for renewal project budgets on the HMIS and Supportive Services Budget Line Items (BLI's).
- ***Proposal: CT BOS will apply a COLA adjustment to new project budgets and raise the Supportive Services budget cap from \$9000 per household to \$9500.***

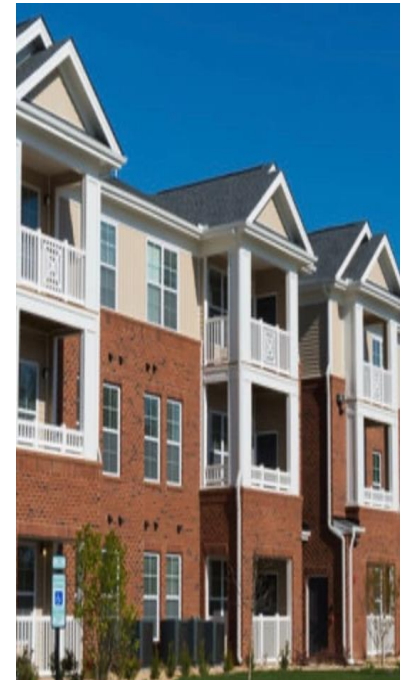

# CoC Builds Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) Letters Of Interest Due 8/19/24

- **Permanent Supportive Housing Only:**
  - Must include new construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation budget line items
  - No more than 20% of awards can be spent on non-capital budget lines, which may be eligible for renewal (project-based rental assistance, supportive services, operating, project admin)
- **VERY COMPETITIVE:** Total funding is \$175 million nationally, HUD expects to make 25 awards (\$65M reserved for small states, 3 awards reserved for Tribes)
  - BOS can request one project - up to \$10M (minimum application amount: \$1M)
